Nature further increases the challenge by giving us a system that precludes completely pure intonation. What does "in tune" mean in a baroque ensemble? What temperaments were used in fixed-pitch instruments such as keyboards during the baroque, and what influence do these temperaments have on the tuning of singers and players of other instruments?
